Notes	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students may waive first- and second-year language training courses with third- or fourth-year language training courses they have taken. In the case of specialized courses, EL4071 can be waived with EL4072, EL3086 with EL3087, EL4007 with EL4008 and EL4011 with 4012. 2. The total number of credit hours for required courses amounts to 114, at least 84 of which must be earned from courses offered by this Department: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) At least 30 of the required 84 credit hours must be earned from Language Training Courses (students should take at least nine credit hours of Language Training Courses in addition to the required courses listed above); (2) At least 45 of the required 84 credit hours must be earned from Professional Courses (students should take at least 15 credit hours of Professional Courses in addition to the required courses listed above); (3) The remaining nine of the required 84 credit hours may be earned from either Language Training Courses or Professional Courses. 3. First year students may take any of the following to fulfill the University's foreign language requirement: (1) Freshman English offered by this Department; (2) other English courses offered by this Department; (3) six course credit hours of an alternative second-language offered or accredited by the Language Center. 4. Course credit hours earned from Remedial English cannot be counted toward the student's minimum number of credit hours required for graduation. 5. The minimum number of earned credit hours required for graduation is 128. 6. Students are required to receive a passing grade in Service Education in accordance with the University's <i>Service Education Implementation Procedures</i> before being permitted to graduate.
