Course Credit Waiver Guidelines for Students in the Graduate Institute of Systems Biology and Bioinformatics at National Central University

- Article 1 These guidelines are provided in accordance with the *National Central University Credit Waiver Guidelines*.
- Article 2 Students who wish to apply for a course credit waiver should do so within the deadline as specified in the academic calendar of their first semester at the University; students may not apply more than once.
- Article 3 Students who have taken master's courses on bioinformatics and systems biology while enrolled in an undergraduate program and received a grade of 75 points or more may apply for a course credit waiver; in such cases, applications are restricted to courses which have not previously been counted toward the student's minimum baccalaureate graduation requirements. Courses which are required by the Institute cannot be waived; there is no limit to the number of elective course credit hours that can be waived.
- Article 4 Students who have taken doctoral courses in bioinformatics and systems biology during their study in the master's programs and received a grade of 75 points or more may apply for a course exemption; in such cases, students must satisfy the Institute's minimum graduation requirements of 18 course credit hours.
- Article 5 Students who have taken graduate courses in a "non-degree conferring program in systems biology" and received a grade of 75 points or more may apply for a course credit waiver; in such cases, applications are restricted to courses which have not previously been counted toward the student's minimum baccalaureate graduation requirements. Courses which are required by the Institute cannot be waived; the maximum number of course credit hours that can be waived is seven.
- Article 6 Students who have taken relevant graduate courses offered by National Central University or other university and received a grade of 75 points or more may apply for a course credit waiver; in such cases, students must provide a brief description of the course content as well as a list of the textbooks used in the courses together with their application form, which will be reviewed by the head of the Institute; the maximum number of course credit hours that can be waived is seven.
- Article 7 Matters not covered in these guidelines shall be conducted in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations of the Ministry of Education and of the University.
- Article 8 The aforementioned guidelines shall be implemented and entered into force upon approval by a meeting of the Institutional Affairs Committee and appraisal and ratification by a meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee. The same procedure applies to any amendment of these guidelines.
