

## **Course Credit Waiver Guidelines for Master's Students in the Department of Chinese Literature at National Central University**

Appraised and ratified at the Academic Affairs Committee Meeting on March 12, 2002

- Article 1 These guidelines are provided in accordance with the *National Central University Credit Waiver Guidelines*.
- Article 2 Master's students in the Department of Chinese Literature [hereafter referred to as "the Department"] who wish to apply for a course credit waiver should do so during their first semester at the University prior to the stipulated deadline; students may not apply more than once.
- Article 3 Students who have received a grade of 70 or more for graduate courses offered by either a Chinese department or Asian Studies department at a foreign university accredited by the Ministry of Education or at a department of Chinese literature and/or language and literacy at one of the normal universities in Taiwan may apply for a course credit waiver. The number of course credit hours that can be waived for courses taken in graduate programs at other institutions cannot exceed one-third of the credit hours required by the Department for graduation; the number of course credit hours that can be waived for courses taken in the Department's graduate program cannot exceed half of the credit hours required by the Department for graduation.
- Article 4 The scope and principles of course credit waivers as well as the granting of waivers for courses with divergent credit hours shall be in compliance with Articles 4, 5 and 6 of the University's *Course Credit Waiver Guidelines*.
- Article 5 Grades earned from waived courses may not be included in the calculation of semester or graduation grade point averages.
- Article 6 The aforementioned guidelines shall be implemented and entered into force upon approval by a meeting of the Departmental Affairs Committee and appraisal and ratification by a meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee. The same procedure applies to any amendment of these guidelines.
