Course Credit Waiver Guidelines for Doctoral Students in the Department of Physics at National Central University

Approved at the Departmental and Institutional Affairs Committee Meeting on November 21, 1995
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Approved at the Departmental Affairs Committee Meeting on September 28, 2007
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- Article 1 These guidelines are provided in accordance with the *National Central University Credit Waiver Guidelines*.
- Article 2 Students who have received a grade of 70 or more for doctoral courses offered by a Physics department may apply for a course credit waiver; in such case, applications are restricted to courses which have not previously been counted toward the student's minimum baccalaureate or master's graduation requirements.
- Article 3 Students who have received a grade of 70 or more for doctoral courses offered by a Physics department may not apply for a course credit waiver if such courses have previously been counted toward the student's minimum baccalaureate or master's graduation requirements. However, students may apply for a course exemption if such courses are identical to those required by the doctoral program at the Department of Physics.
- Article 4 If the waiver is for courses taken from the Department, the full credit hours shall be granted upon confirmation of documents attesting to that fact; but if the waiver is for courses taken from other graduate programs at National Central University or at other universities, the waiver shall be subject to departmental review.
- Article 5 There is no limit to the number of credit hours that can be waived for students who meet the requirements specified in Article 2, but all students are required to take at least two non-special topic courses of two or more credit hours during their term of study in the doctoral program.
- Article 6 Matters not covered in these guidelines shall be conducted in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations of the Ministry of Education and of the University.
- Article 7 The aforementioned guidelines shall be implemented and entered into force upon approval by a meeting of the Departmental Affairs Committee and appraisal and ratification by a meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee. The same procedure applies to any amendment of these guidelines.
