

Courses for Students Pursuing a Minor in English in the College of Liberal Arts

1. Students applying for a minor in English are required to have taken at least one course offered by the English Department.
2. Students minoring in English are required to take at least 30 credit hours of courses from the following list; course credit hours thus earned cannot be counted toward the student's minimum baccalaureate graduation requirements for the degree in which they are majoring.

4. Students applying for a minor in English are required to submit the following applications materials:
- an application form;
 - an official transcript indicating the grades the student has earned in the previous academic year;
 - an essay or statement of 3-4 pages in length (written in English and printed on A4 paper) that explains why the student is applying for a minor in English;
 - one or more recommendation letters from an instructor in the English department.
5. Students seeking to pursue a minor in English must file their applications in the fall semester within the deadline specified in the academic calendar for the year in which they are applying. No applications will be accepted during the spring semester.
