- Integrating the theory and technology of the three fields forming the foundation of green technology—Environmental Studies, Mechanical Engineering and Chemical Engineering—this program is designed to encourage awareness of issues relating to sustainable energy and to cultivate the professional talent needed in the field of Green Technology.
- 2. Students studying in any college or department in the University may apply for entry into this program.
- 3. University students who comply with these guidelines and earn 15 or more credit hours in the program shall have the name of the program as well as the number of credit hours earned clearly indicated on their transcript and shall also be awarded a certificate of completion.
- 4. The curriculum of this program is entirely elective and includes the following eight courses.
