

Guidelines for Students Enrolling in the Non-Degree Conferring Program in Applied Ethics

1. Combining professional training in three areas of applied ethics—life ethics, environmental ethics, and business ethics—this program provides students enables students to conduct research with an ethical orientation in the courses that take from the Colleges of Life Sciences and Environmental Science as well as the School of Management.
2. Students studying in any college in the University may apply for entry into this program; those applying from other schools must comply with all NCU rules and regulations.
3. University students who comply with these guidelines and earn the required number of credit hours shall have the name of the program as well as the number of credit hours earned clearly indicated on their transcript and shall also be awarded a certificate of completion.
4. The courses included in this program are open to individual selection, but students must meet the following requirements to obtain a certificate of completion:

(1) Must earn 20 credit hours or more;

(2) Must take at least three core subject courses and two stream subjects from the following table:
