(1) Students are required to earn a minimum of 25 credit hours of elective courses (excluding course credit hours earned from General Education courses and courses offered in the Education Program) during their term of study at the University, at least 15 of which must be electives specified by this Department; (2) students are required to take two of the following three electives: Introduction to Civil Law (FM2009), Business Law (FM3004), and Securities Transaction Law (FM4013); this requirement also applies to students pursuing a double major in Finance.
- The calculation of semester hours shall not include credit hours earned from General Education courses or History.
- 5. First-year students may take any of the following to fulfill the University's foreign language requirement: (1) Freshman English; (2) other English courses offered by the English department; (3) six course credit hours of an alternative second-language offered or accredited by the Language Center.
- 6. - 7. Students are required to receive a passing grade in Service Education in accordance with the University's *Service Education Implementation Procedures* before being permitted to graduate.
