Course Credit Waiver Guidelines for Students in the Graduate Institute of Astronomy at National Central University

- Article 1 These guidelines are provided in accordance with the *National Central University Credit* Waiver Guidelines.
- Article 2 Students who wish to apply for a course credit waiver should do so within the course selection deadline of their first semester at the University or (in the case of transfer students) first semester in the program.
- Article 3 Master's students who have taken graduate courses offered by the Graduate Institute of Astronomy prior to their admission into the Institute and have received a grade of 70 points or more may apply for a course credit waiver.
- Article 4 Doctoral students who satisfy the abovementioned requirements may not apply for a course credit waiver if credit hours earned from such courses have previously been counted toward the student's minimum graduation requirements for a degree; but if such courses are identical to those required by the Institute, students may apply for a course exemption.
- Article 5 The maximum number of course credit hours that can be waived is 16.
- Article 6 If the waiver is for courses taken from other graduate programs, the application for course credit waivers must be reviewed and approved by the Institute before being put into effect. Grades earned from such courses may not be included in the calculation of the student's semester grade point average.
- Article 7 The aforementioned guidelines shall be implemented and entered into force upon approval by a meeting of the Institutional Affairs Committee and appraisal and ratification by a meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee. The same procedure applies to any amendment of these guidelines.
