Course Credit Waiver Guidelines for Students in the Graduate Institute of Space Science at National Central University

- Article 1 These guidelines are provided in accordance with the *National Central University Credit Waiver Guidelines*.
- Article 2 Any course credit hours for courses which have previously been counted toward the student's minimum graduation requirements for a degree may not be waived.
- Article 3 Students who have taken relevant graduate courses offered by National Central University or by other universities within ten years of their admission into the Institute and have received a grade of no less than 70 points may apply for a course credit waiver.
- Article 4 If the waiver is for courses taken from the Institute (excluding "Special Topics";), the full credit hours shall be granted upon confirmation of documents attesting to that fact; but if the waiver is for courses taken from other graduate programs, the Institute's Curriculum Committee shall decide whether the waiver shall be determined on the basis of an exam or a review of the relevant documents, after which the application shall be approved and ratified at a general meeting of the Institute faculty.
- Article 5 Doctoral students may waive up to 12 course credit hours; master's students may waive up to 22 course credit hours.
- Article 6 Matters not covered in these guidelines shall be conducted in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations of the Ministry of Education and of the University.
- Article 7 The aforementioned guidelines shall be implemented and entered into force upon approval by a meeting of the Institutional Affairs Committee and appraisal and ratification by a meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee. The same procedure applies to any amendment of these guidelines.
